As it was a busy summer for visitors, it was also a busy time for receiving more artifacts. Does anyone remember the name H. Boorse? You would if you took piano lessons. Our esteemed volunteer, Inge Friesenborg Laine brought in a "shingle" of sorts belong-

ing to Mr. Boorse. The Dutt Family dropped off a 1932 silver pitcher engraved with "34th State Encampment-Wildwood, NJ." The Russo Family brought in their "family tree" that hung in their restaurant that closed last month along with a sign from Russo's Restaurant. Karla Svard Frederick brought in a large collection of photographs; mostly Wildwood High School prom pictures from 1956, and class reunion photos for the **Class of 1934**.
