

Curator's Corner

For those of you interested in West Wildwood history, we have acquired many photos over the last few months from **Mayor Chuck Fredericks** and photographer **Tom Kinnemand.** Tom's were taken in the

aftermath of the 1962 storm and depicts the devastation that befell this little island. Tom continues to make many of his old photographs available to us. The last group included photos of the old St. Ann's School coming down and the new school going up; the Martinique and Elmira Nightclub fires, the old Bus Terminal at Oak Avenue and the Boardwalk; classic First Holy Communion photos of the students walking across Atlantic Avenue to the church in 1959. We're told that **Jim Waldron** is leading the procession. He also gave us some scarce photos of the 18th Street Pavilion in North Wildwood taken in the 1950s. From the **John Fulginiti** collection we have a photo taken of a public works project on the corner of Rio Grande and New Jersey Avenues in the 1930s. We also have a photo of WHS South Jersey Champs in 1938. The John Clark Family donated a number of items including photos of Clark Motors and WHS Class Day and Commencement pamphlets for 1931 and 1966. Ken Grace III gave us a photo of the boat, the Ralph J of Anglesea in 1912. Karen and Bob **Dougherty** dropped off a Rotomatic, automatic slide projector. It could come in handy viewing the hundreds of slides that we have in our archives. Bob and Jane Colson Thomson gave us a collection of family memorabilia as did Inge Friesenborg Laine, Jeri Hoffman McDaniel, The Glenn Family and Dan Caterina all the way from Arizona. After our "Salute to Ladies in the Service" event, Jacqueline Hendrickson gave us a photo of her mother Louise in a US Coast Guard Boot Camp photo. This is a small sample of all we have to offer. 
Reminder
